Most value-for-money reds are brash yet the latest mc² release from Rymill is already approaching five years of age. It's a medium-bodied blend at just 13 per cent alcohol and shows little apparent oak. Red fruit dominates the nose with raspberry, red currant and mulberry framed by soft spicy tannins. The palate is soft and gentle but in no way lacking in depth or length. In fact, it's a great lesson on the maxim 'less is more'. Highly recommended.
